

The Georgia World Congress Center Authority and the German American Cultural Foundation bring Atlanta Christkindl Market™ to Centennial Olympic Park

(ATLANTA, Sept. 13, 2019) – On Nov. 21, the Atlanta Christkindl Market[™] will kick off Centennial Olympic Park's winter programming. Formerly located at Atlantic Station, the four-week long holiday event will bring traditional German culture to the heart of downtown Atlanta. "We are very excited about the partnership with Centennial Olympic Park and the Georgia World Congress Center Authority," said Dennis Wagner, Chairman of the German American Cultural Foundation (GAC-F).

Since 2016, this family friendly festival has provided attendees the opportunity to learn more about German-speaking countries through entertainment, authentic food and beverage experiences, arts and crafts, and cultural activities for kids, including workshops and storytelling. Considered GAC-F's official holiday event and the city's largest German Christmas market, the event brought in over 400,000 visitors in 2018.

"Our mutual goal for 2019 is to attract more than 1.2 million visitors and have the biggest and most impressive German Christmas market in the United States," said Joe Bocherer, GWCCA's Chief Commercial Officer. With up to 80 charming Bavarian-style wooden chalets, the festive event creates the authentic German holiday experience with traditional German food, beverages, and handcrafted products such as ornaments, nutcrackers, and toys.
